Sutton Mencap's priorities



We want to carry on running excellent services for children and adults.



We want to run more services so we can help more people.



We want to raise enough money to run our services.



We want to help people learn to use equipment like iPads when they come to Sutton Mencap.



We want everyone who works at Sutton Mencap to enjoy their jobs



We want to use computers to help us manage our services.



We want to make sure our building is a nice place for people to visit.



We want to support people with a learning disability to have their say on what happens in Sutton.



We want to make sure we manage our money well.



We ran services for about 70 children and young people.



We ran clubs which took place after school, on Saturdays and on school holidays.



We ran a youth club called Phoenix Rangers which meets at the Phoenix Centre.



We have a new contract with the council so we can carry on running these services.



We would like even more children to attend these services.



We make sure our staff are properly trained.



BBC Children in Need gave us money to provide outings for children.



We also started a new project to help young people have more of a say about what happens to them.





We ran services for about 190 adults.

The Henry Smith Charity gave us money for three years towards running our adult services.



Our Community Day Activities Service ran on Monday, Tuesday and Friday



We hope to run the service on Wednesday and Thursday as well.



We ran Breakaways on Friday evening and Saturday



We also organised weekends away for Breakaways members.



We ran a drama group called Action Replay.



The group put on shows at the Secombe Theatre and performed at the Guilfest Festival.



The group celebrated 10 years of performances in March 2015.



We ran dance classes for adults on Monday afternoon.



The dance group also performed at shows at the Secombe Theatre



We ran cookery classes on Tuesday at Wallington High School for Girls.



We ran a group called Art Cafe on Tuesday.



We ran a leisure group called Groupies on Tuesday evening.



We ran a leisure group called High Fliers on Wednesday evening.



We ran a healthy living group called Zest on Wednesday afternoon.



We also ran lots of events and parties for adults.



Our Connect 2 friendship project helped friends get together and have fun.

City Bridge Trust have agreed to fund a new Community Link friendship project for the next 3 years.



We worked in partnership with other organisations.



We helped set up the Sutton Together consortium.



Sutton Together helps local charities work together



We bought a new database which helps us keep all our information in one place.



We were also given money by the Sutton Community Fund to buy iPads

We want to run more outings and events for children.




We want to run our Community Day Service on more days.


We want to start our new Community Link project
