The information contained in this easy read report has been extracted from Sutton Mencap's Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March 2025.



Who runs Sutton Mencap?

How is Sutton Mencap run?

AGM Meeting	The trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting.
	This means that the members of Sutton Mencap decide who the trustees are.
	People who are interested in becoming trustees meet with the Chief Executive Officer to find out more about the charity and what the trustees do.
	The Trustee Board meets regularly throughout the year.
LOW RISK HIGH RISK	The trustees have an important role protecting Sutton Mencap from anything that might damage the charity.
	They put together a risk register, which lists all the things they will do to protect Sutton Mencap.
Policy	They make sure that Sutton Mencap has policies and procedures in place and that they are followed.

Sutton Mencap's strategic plan

Plan	In 2019 the Trustee Board agreed a strategic plan which sets the aims of the organisation.
	The first aim in the strategic plan is all about developing and delivering services.
	We want to deliver more services for more people. We also want our services to help people do the things that they want and to make sure our services keep people safe.
Community Lite	The second aim in the plan is all about community development so people can play a greater part in their community.
	We want people with a learning disability to be fully involved in their local community and have a stronger voice about what matters to them.
Sutton mencap	The third aim is all about service support and looks at the things we need as an organisation.
HATTEN AND THE PARTY OF THE PAR	We want to make sure that our building and equipment are suitable and that we have enough money and staff to deliver our services.
	The Trustee Board gets regular reports that show how well Sutton Mencap is doing in achieving these 3 aims.

What we did during the year:

Services for children

	The council asked organisations to send in bids to deliver services to children with higher support needs.
Bid	We sent in a bid but the council did not accept it.
	No one submitted a successful bid, so we are continuing to deliver our services for now.
?	We don't know what will happen to our children's services in the future.

Services for adults

	We supported more people than ever before on our adult services.
Open	Our services are often full, so we want to open new services.



We are planning to do some work on our building which will give us space for more adult services.

Keeping People Safe

Safe Guarding	We continue to make sure we keep people safe at Sutton Mencap.
Training Room	We developed a new safeguarding training course for the trustees.
Report	We set up a new system to give more information to trustees about safeguarding incidents.
Training Room	We make sure staff carry out safeguarding training every 3 years.




	Our Digital Paths to Inclusion project helped people with a learning disability to have a stronger voice.



Finance report


	We continued to deliver more services to more people. This meant we increased the amount of money we received for providing services.
Team	Staff wages went up quite a lot, which meant prices had to go up as well.
Living Wage Employer	Staff wages will go up again next year. We will pay for most of this by increasing services.
	We made improvements to the building, including a new kitchen.
£ £	We keep money in our reserves, in case we need it.
	We think our finances are healthy.

Sutton Mencap's accounts


Annual Report	Our annual report and accounts tell everyone how much money we received, how much we spent, and how much we have left. We compare these figures with the year before.
S. L. Standard	We aim to keep some money to one side each year in case we need it. We call this our reserves.
	Kevin Fisher from a company called Kingston Burrowes is our Auditor. Kevin checks our accounts.
	Kevin has reported that there are no problems with our accounts.
Income Spending	The tables on the next page show how much money we received and how much we spent between April 2024 and March 2025. This is called the Statement of Financial Activities.
Sutton mencap	The page afterwards shows how much Sutton Mencap was worth on 31 st March 2025. This is called the Balance Sheet .

Statement of Financial Activities: Where did our money came from and how did we spend it?

We received £1,122,996. This was £124,510 more than the year before.



We spent £1,114,685. This was £232,619 more than the year before.



We received £8,311 more than we spent.

Balance Sheet: How much is Sutton Mencap worth?

Sutton mencap £££	This sheet explains what Sutton owned on the 31 st March 2025 and how much it was all worth. This is called the Balance Sheet.
Bank	We had money in our bank account, savings account and investments. Altogether, this came to £686,639.
	We have equipment at Sutton Mencap like our minibus, computers, furniture and sensory room. All together these were worth £63,470.
INVOICE	Some people owed us money which they will pay us. This came to £106,133.
Gas Bill Please Pay Now	We also have money which we will need to pay out in the future. This came to £106,134.
F. Parksand	In total, everything Sutton Mencap owns was worth £750,108. This is £8,311 more than in March 2024.
